BABIES

Shamila15 years was taken back home by her old grandma after she had a baby girl on the 13th, she was raped by 5 boys as she went down the well and she will never know the father of the child. As she received on going counseling and praying for her she gained a forgiving spirit and healing took place.

Zaria 16 had a baby boy Daniel on the 7th

Mary 16 had a baby girl Sharon on the 17th. She is an orphan from one of the church based homes. She was raped by a fellow orphan in this home .when she came ,Mary was an angry ,obnoxious filled with bitterness girl. She always picked fights with her fellow pregnant girls. It is awesome to see and know a transformed Mary whose life has turned around completely .I hope she will grow spiritually for she accepted Christ as Lord and Saviour. She has grown up in this orphanage where her" mum" has constantly called her names and now she dreads to go back. Twice they have come for her but she has refused to go with these caretakers. Please pray for her.







GIRLS

We have new 9 girls and the total number is 29 girls. The youngest of all is the 10 year little Shiela who loves cuddling her doll. She is 7 months pregnant and she complains of a severe backache. Doctors have advised that she be operated at 7 months so we will be taken on the 20th of August for the Caesarian Section.

Those that are 14 years are 7 ,the rest are 15 and above.

Among the new girls is an incest case .She was raped by her step brother where she was living with her father and step mum. The boy admitted his fault and pleaded for mercy but his mother and father beat up both Claire and the boy badly that he ended in hospital. These parents tried to terminate the pregnancy but when Claire's real mum was told she,being a Christian refused the idea and rescued Claire by bringing her at Wakisa Ministries.

It was not until the next day that we realized that the new girl Rebecca's feet were all infested with jiggers! She is a rape case, a 16 years old and 6 months pregnant. She is so reserved and quiet that did not complain of any pain of her sore feet! We have been soaking her feet in Savlon twice a week .We thank God that she is now cured .She says three of her siblings at home suffers jigger infestation.

Aisha is 16 years and has been here for 2 months now. The boy who raped Aisha was apprehended by the police and he is in their custody so she has to go to court to testify during the court hearing. Today the 22 year old boy admitted in court that he indeed raped Aisha. She is still angry with this young man and every time she is taken to court she sinks back in depression. Ongoing counselling have been helpful. Please pray for her.

VOCATIONAL SKILLS

The girls are gaining skills for starting income generating small projects when they have their babies. Aisha auntie who brought her and accompanies her to court is overwhelmed at the skills Aisha has acquired in the 2 months she has stayed at Wakisa Ministries. Aisha lacked school fees and so missed out on an education but she will sure make a living through the sales of the homemade samosas. The auntie is so grateful for cookery classes, tailoring, agriculture, handcraft candle making and knitting the girls attend while at Wakisa. The whole group of girl of 29 seems keen to learn these skills. There are 5 that do attend the literacy class too.
