# BABIES born this month are only 3

**1st baby**: Daniel Wakisa was born of Elizabeth Atim 16 years. She had a caesarean section due to obstructed labour. She has stayed her since June when her mother threw her out of the home when she found that Elizabeth was pregnant. She beat Elizabeth so badly that her clothes were torn and sustained wounds on the body. She was rescued from mum's wrath by the neighbours when they heard the screams. A family friend brought her at Wakisa. The boy who made her pregnant denied responsibility and disappeared from his home.

It was during one of the counseling sessions that an olive branch of forgiveness was extended to Elizabeth by the mother as the counselor had a conversation with her on phone.

Elizabeth said she forgave her mum for beating her since she was the one who had committed an offense.



2nd BABY is Samuel born of Hajarah who is 15 years. She had a spontaneous delivery and she was discharged in good condition the second day. She had an unpleasant and difficult childhood when both her parents died. She and her six siblings were each taken to a different home and has since then never seen any of them. Her uncle and his wife who never loved her were less concerned during her crisis pregnancy. It was a church pastor who brought her to Wakisa and later promised to take her in if they could take her baby in an orphanage.

Do lift her to the Lord so that she can be received with her baby and that she can go back to school.



**3rd Baby** is a girl Abigail of Merian 16 years ,she is already gone home while the two are still with us here. The babies were all immunized against polio and tuberculosis.

Maureen who was diagnosed with syphilis after the test turned out positive is on strong treatment for four weeks.

Victoria ,one of the new girls scared wits out her fellow girls as she walked in her sleep and behaved weirdly for 3 nights. They had to share a bed due to fear of Victoria and some believed she had some witchcraft and could put evil spells on them. God heard our prayers as she has not been up and about at night!
