Through your prayers and support we have been to care for 30 young pregnant teenage girls, to offer them a safe shelter, train, feed them, ensure they have access to decent health care, and protect them from emotional, physical and spiritual ravages of a crisis pregnancy.

Admitted In Hospital

Sylvia, one of the young mothers at the center who was admitted in Mulago hospital maternity center at Kawempe because of a constant blood pressure as high as 150/110.

She has been monitored by doctors and they retained her to control the pressure. Sylvia is also with HIV/AIDS. Yesterday she delivered a very weak baby at 32 weeks who was put in an intensive care unit. Sadly this morning the baby passed on.

Let us continue to pray for Sylvia's physical health and emotionally to recover from this note.

Prayer Points

- 1. For Sylvia who suffered eclampsia and loss of baby.
- 2. For good health of the pregnant teenage girls and their babies at the center
- 3. For Kampala City Council authority to give us a licence to start constriction of the new center.
- 4. For the funding base both financial and in kind to remain constant.
- 5. For the teenage mothers in school to perform well and maintain the good discipline.
- 6. For emotional healing of the young mothers .
- 7. For the funding of antenatal and post natal requirements of the National Referral Hospital Mulago Hospital like; gloves, sutures, Syringes, and disinfectant which are now required of every woman in labour, which we have to purchase these items among others.

SKILLS

Health talks have been key this month in the Pregnancy, infant care class as well as the life skills class. This has been key because the majority of the girls are from poor backgrounds and many homes are not keen on hygiene as we have one with skin disease (ring worm) which has covered her whole body .We have tried measures to avoid this skin disease from spreading like fire to others.

We have also taught the girls why they attend antenatal classes at the hospital. We hope that they will teach these reasons to the communities back home when they go back.

As always the girls are encouraged to report any discomfort they have at any one time.

The Saturday candle making class is picking up and the girls are able to plan their activities around the class. The challenge at the moment is to get a person or organisation to purchase the candles so we can earn money to sustain the candle class.

The **agriculture class** has been active. They have finished weeding the Spinach, tomato and Lettuce gardens. The vegetables have been sprayed and are flourishing. We should be harvesting in July.

The **English literacy** class given the girls confidence to express themselves in English and they performed a play where they showed confidence, eloquence and team work. I was quite impressed and bought the girls gifts to appreciate the team effort and good work. The cookery class has been focused on baking. We were able to repair the oven and that is how the baking has been possible. They have baked cupcakes, marble cakes, cookies and sponge cake.

Student Mothers

The 5 young mothers who have been studying professional agriculture at the Agromax training center have finished the 6 months of studying and will be graduating on 28th July. We are truly grateful to Hope Ventures for this support. We are also grateful to Agromax for all their support and training the 8 girls of which 5 have graduated.

The young mothers are; Flavia, Immaculate, Rose, Esther and Brenda the training ended on 26th June 2017.

The girls have attained practical skills in both animal and crop husbandry. They have gotten applicable information and knowledge to start their own projects and create jobs in their communities.

3 young mothers, replacing the 3 who left have already joined the next program at Agromax and will be studying for 6 months.

Back to School

The school Principles been kind enough to let us take back the students back in schools before paying fees. We are trying to raise 5,500 US \$ for these students per semester. It is my prayer that God touches your heart to support and let these young mothers stay learning and being educated . 2 have gone back to Buloba High School, 1 girl has gone back to Namirembe Infant School, 1 to Vision for Africa in Gayaza, and 15 girls were able to go back to St Micheal High School. The rest had completed their senior and left school .We have 3 in the University and one is still being sponsored.

Wakisa Ministries was invited twice to Parliament ,to a Breakfast Meeting and a Parliament Session aimed at 'Ending Violence against Children', The meetings were organised by the Uganda Child Rights NGO Network (UCRNN) in conjunction with the Uganda Parliamentary Forum on Children.

The Speaker of Parliament, Rt.Hon. Rebecca Kadaga tasked Members of Parliament to take the campaign to end child violence to their constituencies. She said that there is a disturbing silence on all kinds of child violence, which is worrying. "We need to go and speak out; let us make this part of our charge in our constituencies as we handle the other issues," she said.
