It was trying moment for our staff on duty at Wakisa as the hospital demanded 500,000 before Samalie could be treated .She was eventually wheeled into the operation room where a baby boy was delivered by Caesarean Section .Though she had lost her consciousness before and after operation, Samalie fully recovered after a week.!!!

NEW GIRLS

This month we have received another girl,
Rosette 13 ,with mental retardation .The two
are gradually coping with the daily but quite a
challenge for the staff to handle the two girls
with special.Harriet is HIV positive and is 8
months pregnant and also mentally challenged.
Peace and Allen ,both 16 years also developed
high blood pressure in their third trimester
150/98 and 160 /100 respectively which is
uncommon among the girls.Peace ,despite her
height she dekivered by Caesarean Section.
4 girls are receiving skin treatment of their severe
ring worm skin disease which is quite expensive

It has been a challenge for the counsellor to communicate with Rosette because she cannot express herself very well.Rosette's mum is a single mum who bobs a job for a living for her 4 children .When she was out one day ,a man by the name Geoffrey came in and raped Rosette .This man run away from the village .Rosette always saw Geoffrey in the community and this is how she could remember his name .There is a good Samaritan in their community who referred the mum to Wakisa Ministries because the mum with her meagre income could not take care of Rosette anymore .She is 4 months pregnant Rosette does not know what is inside her stomach!!!.

Teddy 17 and Brenda 17 are among the new girls and they seem to be possessed with evil !They have .have been screaming on top of of their voices whenever during prayers and morning devotions. The two have very strong background of witchcraft practices .Teddy had suicidal thoughts ,she wanted to abort despite the counselling she received . Last week she became so violent after wriggling on the floor, kicking the house mother as she tried to pull her up. She became too strong for the gate keeper as he tried from the gate which she was pulling down. We had to ask the Remand Home for teenagers .We have stood our ground praying and invited the pastor to pray. Brenda has no more attacks but Teddy has continued so she was taken back home to protect the rest of the girls from harm.

Follow Up News

Daisy was 14 years when she came ,she gave birth to baby Daniel and apparently she is still breast feeding. She and the baby do not have any illness or allergies .In addition to tailoring, Daisy has developed hair dressing skills and is a professional with pencil hair plaiting. She would like to get a job in a saloon and plait hair. Pencil in particular Spiritually she has developed and grown in her relationship with the Lord. She regularly fellowships at nearby Pentecostal church called Miracle Center Church though she is not yet fully involved in ministry. She intends to use and develop the skills she acquired at Wakisa to develop and accomplish on her goals in future.

Miriam is now 17 ,she gave birth to a baby boy last year .She lives with the her father and grandmum and the dad decided to take Miriam back to school She is in a day school called Old Kampala in senior 3. She would love to be a Journalist when she goes to University .Her grandmum is taking good care of baby Israel.

Irene a young mother went back in June who was taken back home to Masindi .Her auntie bought her a sewing machine when Irene told her about the short tailoring course she had at Wakisa she is happily making a living by mending clothes and making dresses for her community.
