Making Chapatti, cakes, new types of dishes, candles and many other things kept my mind busy not asking myself where I was going after having a baby and the bible study helped me keep my faith in God. For the first time in my life I was not worried about a thing. I would sleep all night long and wake up in the morning to find a smile on the aunties faces. The only description I can give to Wakisa is my safe haven and home. I am grateful for everyone and everything from Mum, aunties and the girls. God bless the work of your hand and may He keep guiding you in all you do.”

PHIONA

Phiona is 16 years old and is the second born of four siblings. Phiona grew up with her grandmother while other siblings were staying with their parents. Phiona however, only stayed a few years with her grandmother and had to leave because the grandmothers financial obligations were only getting more expensive and she could not handle the burden.

Phiona went back home and unfortunately could not continue with school. She started working in her mother's garden. Her mother is a peasant farmer. When she was not in the garden, Phiona and her friends would go to the market. This is where she met Fred who became her friend. Soon they were having relations and before long, she was pregnant.

When the father got to know about her pregnancy, he was furious and chased her away from home, the mother had nowhere to take her so she planned with Phiona's elder sister to bring her to Kampala and abandoned her on the streets.

When Phiona and the sister reached Kampala, the sister instructed her to sit near a mobile money agent shop so she could go buy a few things. Her sister never came back. Phiona had never been to the big city and started getting scared as evening drew close. By standers noticed she was unsettled, scared and took her to the Police Station where she met friendly officers that brought her to Wakisa.

We are working with the policemen to find the family.
