VOCATIONAL SKILLS TRAINING

The skills training is the main component of the activities at Wakisa .This group of young girls enjoy the classes of tailoring, cookery, candle making and handcraft with paper bead making and computer.

They have been engaged in bible classes throughout the month, following the Alpha

course. They have memorized various verses, and through prayer, their spiritual growth is evident and girls are encouraged to apply the word in their daily lives. Most inspiring is they have understood Psalm 139, that both them and the babies inside their womb are wonderfully and fearfully made.

14 year old Vivian is mentally retarded. She was raped as she was going to the well to fetch water.

Her mother was furious and did not believe her when she told her she was raped. Vivian is now two months pregnant. Her single mother wanted her to procure an abortion and so took her to a medical officer .This Christian medical officer happened to know about Wakisa Ministries and he referred the mother to us. Vivian was brought to us and has since settled in. She does not remember what the person who raped her looked like. She often responds by smiling to the counselor and it takes ages to get any information from her. Sadly when she was tested for HIV she was found positive .Please pray for Vivian.

We have two pregnant girls who have been found HIV positive on testing.

Sylvia who is 13 years was raped several times by her uncle .She told the uncle's wife but the uncle denied. When Sylvia's mum found out she was pregnant, she became so harsh and cruel, treated her badly that she rationed her meals. Sylvia's mum feared to confront the uncle and opted for an abortion. Sylvia decided to flee from home and a Good Samaritan brought her to Wakisa Ministries. She was advised not to procure an abortion.

Sylvia's cherishes her stay at Wakisa Ministries and through the Bible study and counseling, she has forgiven her uncle. She is enjoying candle making and tailoring.
