Our outreach and Follow up programmes this month targeted the young mums whom Wakisa has been able to reintegrate in schools. It has been a joy to see and find these young mums back on track with a bright future thus, the impact of Wakisa services clearly shown through the lives of these young mums to the glory of God. **THANK YOU for enabling the impact.**

The stories have been encouraging and this compels us to continue serving as God's instruments of change for a girl child despite the challenges in our country.

Among those visited is Shakira, an orphan who is now 19 years. She was brought at the center when she was 17 and a month pregnant. She had been raped by her brother, it had hurt her so much and she was suicidal. The Counselling and the vocational and life skills changed her and she gained a heart of gold! She gave birth to a baby boy Brighton who is one and half years.

The brother ran away from their home, the grandmothers place where both were staying after the death of their parents. Although she says she forgave the brother, she vows with tears in her eyes never to talk to him again

Shakira is one of the many girls that Wakisa Ministries has sponsored in Agromax for a six months Urban Agriculture course. She completed the course and has a home vegetable garden which earns her a living!

Diana who was rejected by her parents and entire family when she conceived says she received healing, unconditional love and care at Wakisa. She also acquired skills of making bags and now she earns a living through selling these bags and necklaces.

Though she completed the senior and went on to University when her parents forgave her, it has not been easy for her to get a job. Thanks to the VOCATIONAL SKILLS donations.


Something good came out of a crisis pregnancy!

It was a very moving and emotional moment at Wakisa Ministries last week! Elizabeth was brought at Wakisa Ministries by a Probation Officer. Elizabeth was thrown out of home when she conceived at the age of 17. She was sleeping and staying in a church for some time by the time they brought her.

She and her brother had been left with an auntie by their father when his wife walked away from home leaving him with these two children. The father failed to take care of them and brought them to stay with an auntie.

Elizabeth who last saw her mum at the age of 9, found love in a man who later rejected her when she conceived. The auntie could not stay with her when she was pregnant, so she threw Elizabeth out of home. This young girl found a church building where she stayed for a month until the Good Samaritan took her to the probation officer who later brought her to Wakisa.

She has delivered a beautiful baby girl but we did not have a home to take her and her daughter. As a miracle, her mum was traced by a Justice for Women organization and the mother was brought to Wakisa. We were all touched when the mother was brought to Wakisa, looked at her daughter and broke down and cried uncontrollably! So, did Elizabeth, so did we! Elizabeth and her baby are now staying with her mum

ADMISSIONS

Among the new girls are two who are mentally retarded.

One Mary, 14-year-old was brought by an organization when they realized she had missed her periods for 3 months.

She has a sad story where her life has been affected at the age of 9 by her late father. He for a long time abused her sexually taking advantage of her mental state until he died. The father, who was suffering from HIV since he lost his wife, also infected his daughter! Mary, thinking it was the norm, started demanding for sex from any man after the death of his father.

The organization that took her in has been shielding Mary from such abuse until she recently went back home to visit her relatives. One of her relatives took advantage of her, she informed the staff when she came back and had missed her periods for some two months.

It has not been easy to offer Mary any counselling or to teach her any skills because she needs specialized attention. We are yet to find out where in our country we can refer a pregnant girl who is mentally challenged.
