All was well until one day while her step mother had gone to visit relatives and her siblings were asleep, Lovinsa's father took advantage of her and abused her telling Lovinsa that she should keep this a secret. He also told her that this act was an instruction from the witch doctor as a ritual to get rich and it would only work if no one else knew.

A few months later, her belly begun to grow and her aunties took her to the police station and she narrated what had appened. The police imprisoned her father and she is now with us as she walks this journey.

DELIVERIES

We have had 1 delivery this month. Phiona, 15 years old had a baby girl.

Phiona is a third born of 5 siblings. She studied up to primary 5 when her teacher got her pregnant. When she realized she was pregnant she planned with her friend on an escape route from the father's anger. At first, she tried to have an abortion but the procedure was not successful, they tried plan 'B, which was escaping from home. Phiona escaped from home and came to Kampala where she was rescued by the police as a missing child and brought to Wakisa Ministries.

While at Wakisa, the counselling department liaised with the police and probation officer to find her family and her father was glad to receive the news she was well and in no danger. Phionah gave birth to a premature baby girl who passed away after one day. Phionah was taken back home by her father.

The counsellors and father are working closely to support Phionah. Do remember her in your prayers that the good Lord be with her and comfort her.



ADMISSIONS

Among the new 9 admissions this month are two 13 year old pregnant girls and they are both incest cases.

The total number of girls now is 29 girls at the Centre .One of them is Rose , a young mum sponsored in school but cannot go home in school holidays because she is a incest survivor .So Wakisa is currently her home from school.

VOCATIONAL SKILLS

The vocational classes the girls attend include; computer basic skills ,candle making, cookery, tailoring, knitting and life skills such as infant care, Bible study and play/exercise time.

The 6 girls at Agromax have finished the agricultural program and are excited to go out and practise what they have been learning.

We currently have a waiting list of 31 girls who are interested in going back to school to continue with education or start or learn a professional skill.
