Dear Friend and Partner in Ministry,

Christmas greetings to you! Unto us a CHILD JESUS CHRIST was born. We are ever so grateful for your support ,so thankful to the Lord God for the care, prayers and love towards these young mothers.

We give glory to God for your partnership which is greatly appreciated.

The Closure of the home seems to be indefinate though we submitted the application forms for a license a month ago .The waiting seems too long, it's almost 4 months since the closure.

Sandra (17yrs) came with a teacher from school. Betty (18yrs) was referred to Wakisa ministries and Mary(14yrs) was raped by a family member. All the 3 are pregnant but we have not been able to take them in due to the licence. However we are;

- Offering counselling to those who have come at Wakisa with Crisis Pregnancy
- Following up on young mothers who have gone back home
- · Offering Baby clothes, clothing and counselling.
- Short listing the young mothers and soliciting funds to take them back to school.
- We have set up a vocational day class for young mothers who are near and the girls in vacation .
- Visted schools and distributed YOUTH AIM HIGH booklets.and Introduced a LEARN FROM ME PROGRAMME
- Becoming the leading Trauma counselling trainers for nurses, teachers and church ministers in the country

When a teenage daughter in Uganda breaks the news that she was pregnant to her parents. It is shock, accusation and blame, and rarely any compassion and understanding. It is our heart's desire at Wakisa Ministries to protect the girls and children and ensure that they lead the best possible life.

Uganda is said to have one of the highest rates of teenage pregnancy rate in Sub Saharan Africa. One in four women in Uganda have a child by nineteen (Guardian – we see Mothers Die and children die: Uganda's Teen Pregnancy Crisis). The purpose of the centre is to provide information, counselling and support to girls aged 10 -19.

There will be an impact by the closure of the centre, girls who become pregnant will be traumatised, more at risk. They may be accepted in the home but they become second class citizens. This issue is very complex and affects the whole community.

Wakisa Ministries was and is trying to shine a light on the issue of teenage pregnancy, why it is happening and the impact on the girl and the family's life.





ACTIVITIES

We are no longer managing the crisis but are having a paradigm shift now, maintaining our main objective of Promotion of dignity and self-esteem of young girls especially those with crisis pregnancy.

Genesis 50:20 is so true at such a time as this at Wakisa Ministries since the closure.

HIGHLIGHTS

- We have been in 3 schools in the month of November and talked to over 5000 students and pupils on how to be sexually pure. The Youth Aim High books have been distributed.
- This is a long holiday and we have embarked on teaching lessons in cookery, bible study, tailoring ,computer and Sexuality. We are running a day holiday program for both young mothers and girls where 30 girls have registered.
- These two months, 17 phone calls have been received, from pregnant girls near and far who are in crisis pregnancy. We have managed to offer counselling by phone and endeavoured to visit them.
- One 17-year-old disabled pregnant girl was dropped at our gate when we were about to close. She had a letter from the police, we kept her for a night and we contacted a member of her family and paid for her transport to this family member to the western part of Uganda. She was raped by at the bus park at night when she had come to Kampala to get herself a new pair of shoes for the crippled feet!
- We have trained 50 pastors of Bunyoro-Kitara Diocese in Trauma Counselling Workshop.
- We are in the process of mobilising funds for 30 more young mothers to reintegrate them into schools on addition to the 20 who are under the scholarship program.
