One of the challenges is a 13 year pregnant girl we received with mental illness which we thought was mild ,only to find that she was aggressive to her fellow girls ,undressing herself publicly and passing urine anywhere. Our doctor looked at Malaria and AIDS which had never been managed as the cause of her mental illness . She has now been transferred to the Psychiatric Hosptital. Sylvia was picked on the streets when she was brought to Wakisa and her is still unknown . It is Wakisa Ministries to follow up on her and visit her in this hospital.

We are grateful to God for the 12 girls that have accepted Christ .



Admissions

There have been 3 admissions with challenges healthwise which are highly infectious if untreated.

A 17 year old with Tuberculosis and Epilepsy

13 year old with AIDS and Mental illness

13 year old with Hepatitis B

This month we supported 28 girls at the center; 3 of them have new borns and are doing well. Pray for the 2 young mothers who had ceaserean section.

We admitted 9 girls with crisis pregnancies and resettled 5 girls.

Sylvia's Situation

Sylvia, is a special needs girl who requires assistance both mentally and medically. The probabition officer from Gomba District brought her to Wakisa Ministries after community members expressed concern to her for Sylivia who had no family. She had loitered from village to village and was believed to have been sexually abused. This was later confirmed during the medical exam.

The community members took her to the local authorities who made many annoucements on radio and community speakers regarding Sylvia but none of the family members showed up to come and collect her. The police had no missing persons case registered either and so she was brought to Wakisa Ministries with the support of the Local Chairman and Probation Officer.

At Wakisa Ministries, the medical exams and mental health assessments showed she had been abused. When we received her at the center she went through a diagnosis and discovered she was psychotic. For the few weeks she was at Wakisa, Sylvia smiled, shared, slept and was cared for. However, she started getting violent and harming fellow girls. In order to protect other girls from being harmed we reffered her to Butabika Mental Health Facility.

We are working together with the hospital to see that Sylvia's transfer is smooth and that she gets all the care she needs.

Graduation

The girls at Agromax finished their skills training and were awarded certificates. What joy and pride they have brought to us all.

We held a social distanced ceremony at Agromax with their teachers. 2 of the girls did so well that Agromax has retained them as interns.

We pray and hope that more families will support and encourage the young girls to be empowered through skills training and education.

September has been the favourable month for the Agriculture class where so many activities have been carried out in the garden.

At the same time girls have been feeding on the green leavy veggies and for months now we have not spent money on buying the vegetables

Vocational classes of Computer lessons, cookery, tailoring, knitting class, arts and

crafts,Bible study (Alpha course for beginners), life skills class, infant care, hair dressing and Agric.

Girls have been introduced to netball and aerobics and keep fit exercise by Anna from Germany and Christina from the Netherland . Anna is doing a good job teaching to computer basics and typing skills to the girls .

This month in the knitting class, the girls were taught how to make baby stockings, and how to make baby blankets. In the hair dressing class, twisting hair and cornrows.
